

Dear Transfiguration School and Parish Community,

The faculty, staff, and I believe that athletics are an important part of the total education program offered at the school. However, in keeping with the school's philosophy, high standards of behavior and citizenship are vital to a sound athletic program. These standards apply to students volunteering to participate in the sport of basketball, volleyball and/or twirling, as well as for students who are spectators.

Anyone who plays or attends a sporting event at Transfiguration School must abide by the same behavior expectations as if school was in session.

- No one is allowed to be dropped off at a game and not picked up promptly by the end of the game. Lateness in picking up children is a liability and an inconvenience to the coaches and other parents.
- If you are coming to the game and are dropped off, children are to watch the game and not play unattended outside on the playground. It is a liability to the school and one that we absolutely refuse to allow.
- Parents who are on duty in the lobby during the games have the responsibility of not allowing children (whether they are Transfiguration School children or opposing team spectators), to run in the lobby, play outside unattended, climb on the gates in the hall, bounce balls in the hall, climb on furniture, play in the bathroom, or leave doors open.
- The school must be left in the same condition as when the game started. All garbage needs to be picked up and taken outside to the dumpster, floors in the lobby vacuumed, stage and gym floor swept, lights turned off, chairs put back, and doors locked.

The faculty, staff and administration of Transfiguration School take pride in our school and our student athletes. We want to ensure that everyone who enters this school reflects that same pride and responsibility.
